





CompleteView Live View Quick Reference

	Steps	
Login to Client	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select Windows Start. 2. Scroll to S. 3. Select Salient Security Platform. 4. Select CompleteView. 5. Enter your credentials 	Or, double-click the CompleteView icon. 
Live View	Click Live View task. Select any views that are listed under Views / Maps, or Cameras under Servers / Cameras.	
Video to Full Screen	Full screen: Hit F11 on the keyboard. Return to original size: Hit F11 a second time.	
Expand Video	Expands the video in a multi- view to a full display single view. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select any live view that is currently displaying video in a multi-view layout. 2. Double-click on live view to toggle between multi & single view. 	
Search for Recorded Video	Searches for recorded video for the <u>selected</u> camera. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Right click on the video that you wish to search. 2. Select Recorded Video. 3. Select Search by List; select a start and end time. 4. Click the Search button. 5. Double-click on any clip. 6. Use the playback controls below the displayed video to navigate the video. 7. Click Live View in the top menu to return to live video. 	
Quick Review	Review up to the last 10 minutes of video from any camera. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Right click on the live view that you wish to review. 2. Select Quick Review. 3. Select the number of seconds or minutes that you wish to review. 4. Use the playback controls on the viewer to stop and start video. 	
Custom Views	Build as many custom views as you wish. In the left area where views are listed: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Expand Custom / Favorites then Custom, right click Views, and select New View. 2. Name the Custom View. 3. Expand the desired servers and cameras in the navigation pane on the left. 4. Drag and drop cameras from the server(s) into the Custom View panes. 5. Click the Save icon.  	

PTZ Camera Control	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select a PTZ Camera live view. 2. Use the direction arrows in the control panel. 3. Toggle the Start Tour button to start & stop a PTZ camera configured to tour.
Video Client Maps	<p>Select any of the maps that are listed on the left side of the client.</p>
Search for Recorded Video	<p>Searches for recorded video for the <u>selected</u> camera</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Right click on any displayed live view. 2. Select Recorded Video. 3. Select Search by List; select a start and end time. 4. Click the Search button. 5. Double-click on any clip. 6. Use the playback controls below the displayed video to start and playback the video. 7. Click Live View in the top menu to return to live video.
Quick Review	<p>Reviews up to the last 10 minutes of video from any camera.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Right-click on any camera on the map. 2. Select Quick Review. 3. Select the number of seconds or minutes that you wish to review. 4. Use the playback controls on the viewer to stop and start video.
View Live Video	<p>Displays live video from a Map</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Selecting a desired map from the left pane will display the live video from its associated cameras along with the map.
Video Playback	<p>Click the Playback button at the top of the Client. </p> <p>Search for video clips recorded by a server's cameras.</p>
Review Recorded Video - Date Search	<p>Review recorded video by date and time.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Verify Review Video is selected.  2. Locate the camera(s), view, or map within the left pane of the client.  3. Drag and drop the camera(s), view, or map into the right pane of the client. 4. Select a start and end time.  5. Use the playback controls below the displayed video to navigate the video.  6. From the upper right menu, select Clear View to remove cameras. 

Search Recorded Video – Thumbnail Search

Searches for recorded video within a specified date and time range, returning a series of playable, equally divided clips presented as thumbnail images.


1. In Live View, right click on the camera, select **Recorded Video**, then **Search by Thumbnails**.
2. Verify the **server and camera** from the pull-down menus.
3. Select a **start and end** date and time.
4. Select the appropriate **Time Zone** setting.
5. Select the **Time Interval** and **Thumbnail Size** using the slider, if desired. Click **Search**.




Exporting Video

Export recorded video after conducting a Date Search or Smart Search.

Select a video clip to export.

1. Click the **Export Queue** button from the  bottom right corner of the screen.

2. Click the **checkmark** to add to the **Export Queue**. 

Note: Optionally use the sliders to select only a portion of the clip to export.



3. Select the **Export Queue** in the toolbar at the top right.



4. Select the clip, and optionally enter a **Description**.


5. Select the **Export Destination** and provide the required information.

- A. Optionally include **Video Player**.
- B. Optionally zip the file.

6. Optionally utilize **Export Session**.

- A. Include a **Title**.
- B. Include a **Description**.
- C. Include an **Incident Location**.


7. Click **Export** or **Export All**.






Snap Shot

Take a snapshot of recorded video during playback

1. Complete **Date Search**, **Smart Search**, or select **Search Video** from Live View.
2. Select a **video clip** from the results box.
3. Click **Save Snapshot** button located on the playback control panel. 
4. Choose your desired format by clicking on **Save BMP**, **Save JPEG**, or **Print**.

Note: When you choose to Save BMP or Save JPEG you will be prompted to browse to the desired location for saving the file.

Video Player	Playing clips back after export.	
Video Player	<p>Review up to 16 recorded video clips with the Video Player</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Launch Video Player from CompleteView list of programs (in the Windows Start menu). 2. When the Video Player opens, select File then select Open. 3. Select the desired video clips from the CD, DVD, or file. Note: You can select multiple clips at once by holding the Ctrl button on your keyboard while selecting the clips with your mouse. 4. Use the video controls to stop and start the video player. 	
Verify Video as Tamper Free	<p>With video showing in the Video Player:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Select File. 2. Select Verify. <p>The player will validate all video being displayed. Wait for a response.</p>	
QuickTrack Camera	<p>Use a QuickTrack Camera to capture and join multiple video streams into one recorded video stream.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Click the QuickTrack button, then Start QuickTrack. 2. Click on the desired video feed to begin recording. 3. Follow the action by clicking on each subsequent video feed as the event progresses. 4. Click Stop QuickTrack when finished. 5. Click Review Video to view the recording.
